



Condition of Play for Monomeeth Salver

1. Teams to consist of 24 Players - 12 to play on home course and 4 to play at each of the other 3 courses. It is to be left to the discretion of each club as to whether the teams are to be sent out in 2 or 4. Visiting clubs have the honour.
2. Matches to be played off handicap with no handicap limit. The full handicap difference to be given. Players to play in order of handicap and lists to be exchanged by team captains. Once team sheet has been submitted to host Club that is as the team stands. To be played under WGNSW conditions. Motorised transport may be used by any player if allowed on the course.
3. The Golf Australia Handicap and daily handicap at the course of play to be entered on the list exchanged by team captains. The Golf Australia Handicap [GA] as of the previous Monday 6.00pm.
4. No Match to be played beyond the 18th hole, and players to walk in off the course when the match is finished.
5. When a player withdraws on the morning of the match, all of the lower graded must move up in order players. If a reserve is supplied on the team sheet they are permitted to play in handicap order.
6. In the event of a player being late she is allowed 15minutes after the team hit-off time. If this happens, the handicap order of the team cannot change, but the order of hit-off may change to accommodate the late arrival. Should a player be later than 15 minutes from the scheduled tee time that match is forfeited.
7. Host clubs are responsible for the phoning results through to be previous years winning club as soon as each match is completed.
8. The winner is to be decided by individual game. In the event of a tie, the Salver is to be held by each winner for an equal period of time.
10. Matches are to be played out under all elements unless a course is closed due to extreme weather conditions, in which case the entire event will be cancelled. The Captain of the affected course will contact the other Club Captains.
11. The engraving of the Salver will be arranged and paid for by the winning club.
13. A light lunch is to be provided by host Club (cost not specified as this may vary depending on each Club's caterers).
14. The presentation is to be made after the conclusion of play (approx. 2pm) at the Club that holds the Salver. It is the responsibility of this club to phone through the results to AAP. A meeting of the Club Captains will follow the presentation at approximately 2.30pm.

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
